Each year Broadway's boys and girls of summer gather on the softball fields of Central Park. Their quest: to bring the same magic to the diamond that they bring to the stage eight times a week--and to have lots of fun trying. The Broadway Show League, now in its 48th season, has long been Broadway's favorite summer pastime, for stars and stagehands alike.

The league began in the 1940's as a Wednesday afternoon diversion between matinees and evening performances. Now held on Thursdays, games feature teams of people who work on Broadway and Off-Broadway shows, union members and employees of theatrical organizations. Last season Michelob Light stepped up to the plate as the league's sponsor, and has since supplied uniforms and post-game
