

Edward William Nelson - Death Valley Expedition, 1890-1891

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
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Thomomys signs along this creek where the moist, fertile soil gives them convenient range from the mts. down through the sage brush desert to the river bottom - found a flock of Cal. Frail on the fluff at mouth of creek at sundown. They went to roost in patches of tule & mushes in the bottom after I shot at them & on my way to camp at dusk they flew out after fluttering desperately in the

dense reeds for a few moments.
