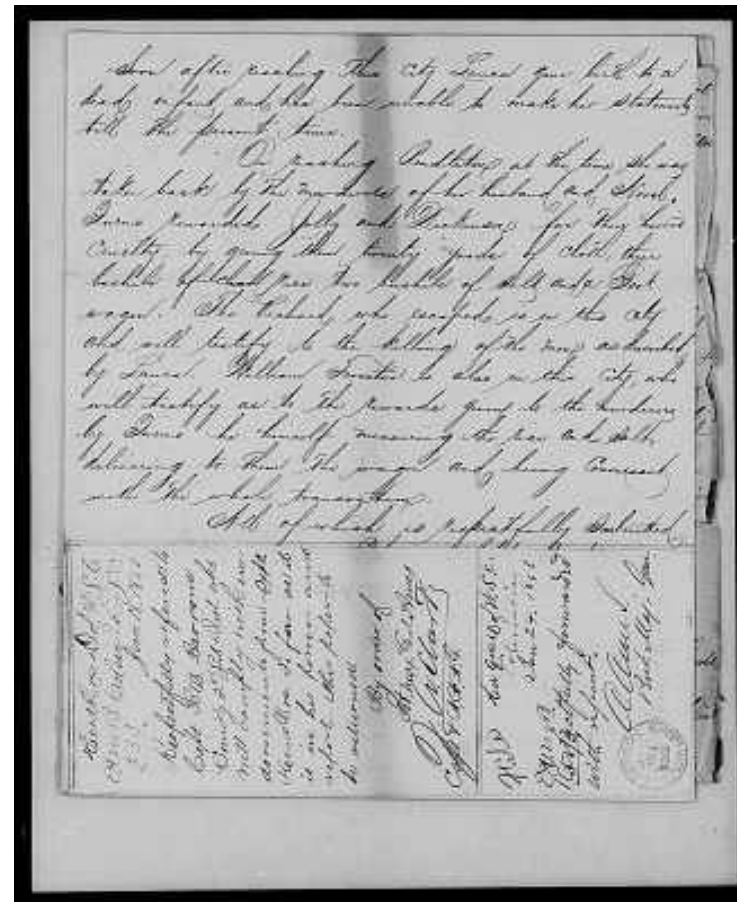
Soon after reaching this City Laura gave birth to a dead infant and has been unable to make her statements till the present time. On reaching Pendleton at the time she was taken back by the murderers of her husband and Novel, Turno rewarded Jolly and Dickinson for their horrid cruelty, by giving them twenty yards of cloth, three bushels of clean rice two bushels of salt and a Gov't wagon. The Richard who escaped is in this city and will testify to the killing of the men as described by Laura. William Forester is also in this City, who will testify as to the rewards given to the murderers by Turno he himself measuring the rice and salt, delivering to them the wagon and being Conversant with the whole transaction.
