Unfortunately my phone call to Mr. Key came through before your arrival so I am passing on to you the following:

1 - Key will give you a bill of sale in the amount of four thousand five hundred dollars in exchange for two drafts, one in the amount mentioned, and the other, for sixteen hundred dollars.

2 - The car will be delivered at the Office of our Agents in the Hamilton Hotel, Building, Laredo, Texas, at noon on Thursday, January 25.
