Swinging a bottle of bubbling champagne over the bow of the \$310,000 red, white and blue aircraft, a lovely airline stewardess ably assisted by civic and city leaders, made the name official as a highlight of the inauguration of the new air transportation service here.

Tomorrow (June 1), the first flight will leave San Francisco Airport for the Oakland Heliport at 6:30 a.m., then return to San Francisco Airport via the Oakland Airport. From then on, combinations of this route will be flown 30 times each day linking the San Francisco and Oakland airports with downtown heliports in both cities. On June 15, the flight frequency will be increased to 60 flights each day. Flights to Berkeley, Palo Alto, San Jose and Sacramento will be added in the near future.
