cheque to 15 Lathbury Road, Oxford, England.

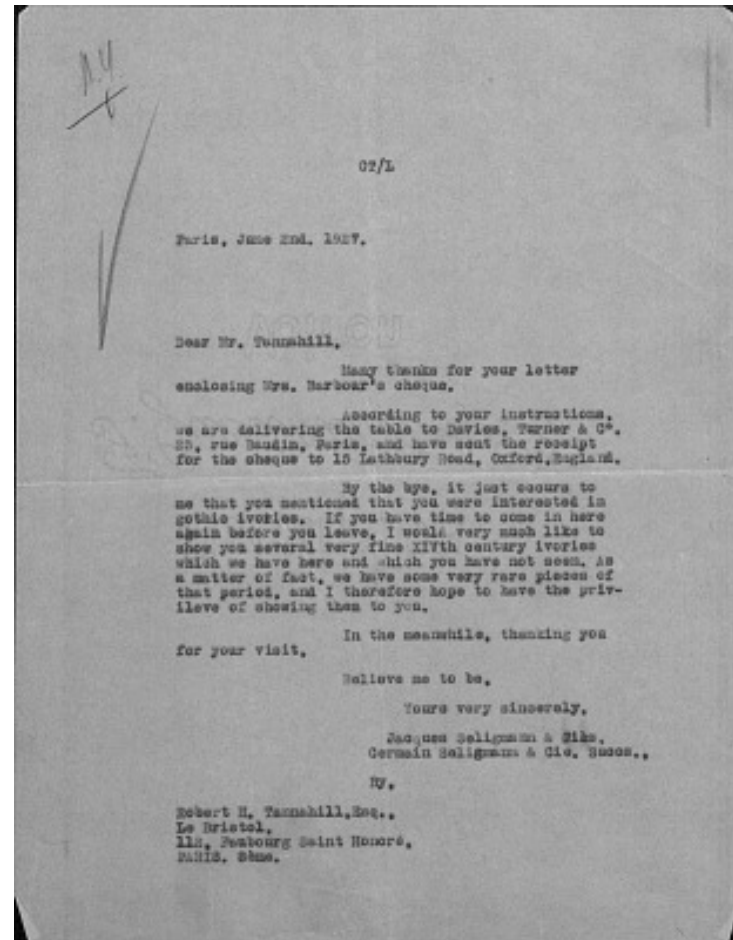
By the bye, it just occurs to me that you mentioned that you were
