Loss of Unspoiled W

A report showing a rapid drop in Maryland's unspoiled wetland acreage brought expressions of alarm and dismay yesterday from the State's Board of Natural Resources.

Roy E. Walsh, chairman of the Board, said he was "shocked over the percentages of wetlands lost."

Prince George's County, the study said, lost the greatest wetland acreage since an inventory in 1955, followed by Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Cecil and Queen Anne counties.
