Dear Dr. Waugh:

Thanks for sending me the program of the American Association of Dental Schools. No doubt I will see you in Chicago, I will arrive on Saturday morning but will stay over Monday and Tuesday. I would like very much to place before the school authorities the opportunity our Service presents to the new graduate with reference to dental internship in our marine hospitals. The problem of securing the right kind of man power is a very serious one for government services, but if Deans of schools are familiar with our plans and will co-operate, we undoubtedly can secure the right kind of officer personnel for the future.

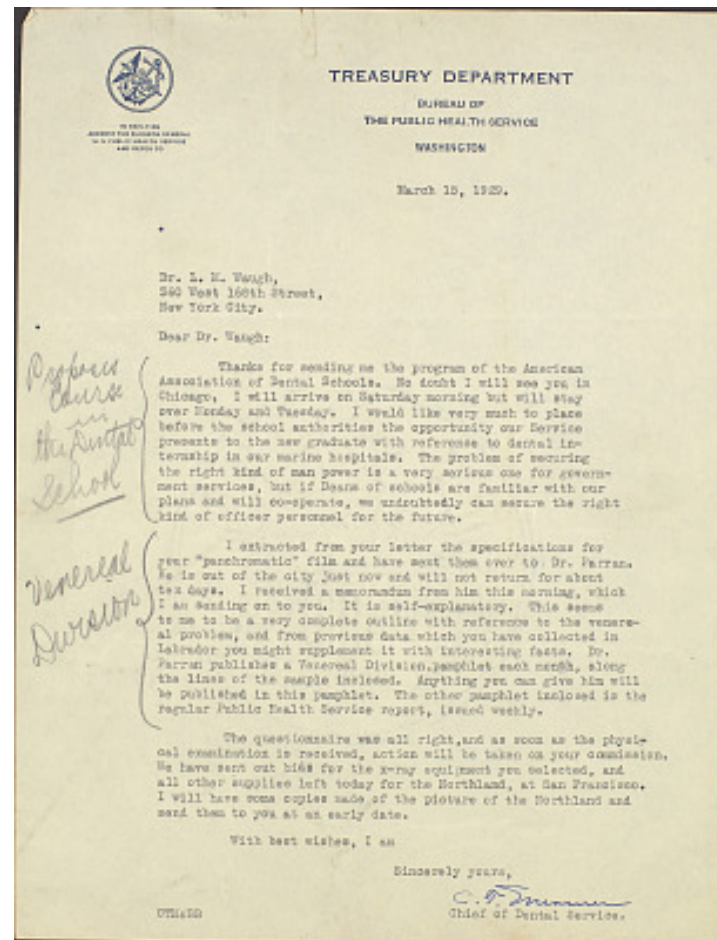
I extracted from your letter the specifications for your "panchromatic" film and have sent them over to Dr. Parran. He is out of the city just now and will not return for about ten days. I received a memorandum from him this morning, which I am sending on to you. It is self-explanatory. This seems to be a very complete outline with reference to the venereal problem, and from previous data which you have collected in Labrador you might supplement it with interesting facts. Dr. Parran publishes a Venereal Division pamphlet each month, along the lines of the sample inclosed. Anything you can give him will be published in this pamphlet. The other pamphlet inclosed is the regular Public Health Service report, issued weekly.

The questionnaire was all right, and as soon as the physical examination is received, action will be taken on your commission. We have sent out bids for the x-ray equipment you selected, and all other supplies left today for the Northland, at San Francisco. I will have some copies made of the picture of the Northland and send them to you at an early date.
