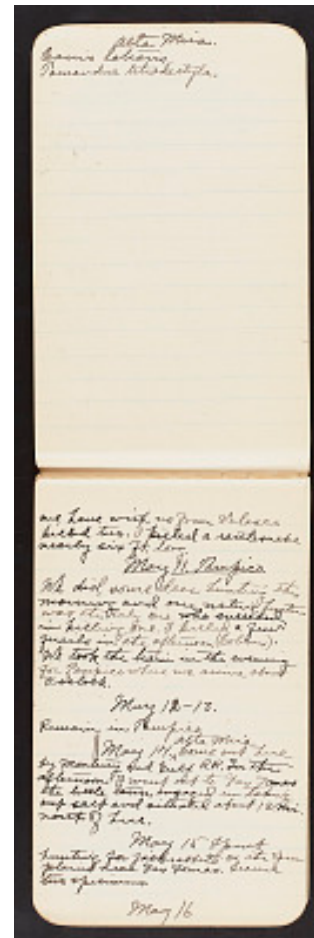
May 12-13.

May 14. Alta Mira. Come out here by Monterey and Gulf R.R. In the afternoon I went out to Las Lomas the little town engaged in taking out salt and situated about 12. mi north of here.

May 15 Spent hunting for jack rabbits on the open plains near Las Lomas. Secure two specimens.
