Commanding Officer Post of Goldsboro North Carolina

Sir

On the 24th of last month I sent a requisition for Requistion for Rations for the Orphan Asylum of Middle Sound, near this city under charge of the Bureau. This Registration was for the present month, and I requested that the Rations might be sent without delay, as I had only drawn up to August 31. The Rations have not been sent yet and the children are without food, except what I could borrow. Will you please direct the Commanding or Commissioner to send immediately? 
