
Sept 5th 1865

Si McNeal (Freedman) lives with Mr. Macon McLeod in Bladen Co on Brown Marsh working on farm has two sons who had been working for John E. McCall States that McCall beat & kicked his boys (Oliver and Mavoney) that he took the boys away from McCall when he threatened to shoot him and called at his house and Sunday with a gun and asked his wife where he (son) was. Mr. McLeod then advised him to come away as he did not consider his life safe. Si states that Mr. John McCall Father of John E. drove him off the farm refuses to pay him for his work - Si can be found on Mr. Hill's plantation near Little Bridge. Sept. 6th 1865

Lucinda States that Mr.James H. Lucas of Bladen County beat her also one of her children and then drove her off the farm menacing her with an axe told her she was not free, wishes permission to bring her children away and wants pay for her work. She and her three children all work on the farm - Mr. Lucas lives near Deepwater Point Landing, Bladen - [[overwritten]] Transferred [[/overwritten]]
