Rations drawn for Destitute "Freedpeople" in "Sub Dist of Wilmington" for 7 days from date 22 Men 144 Women & one hundred & seventy Children = 1757

May 10th 1866

Rations Drawn for 22 men 144 women & 170 children for 7 days from date "Sub Dist Wil" = 1757

#### May 10th

Rations Drawn for Destitute freedmen at Fort Anderson 40 Women 30 children for 7 days from Date = 385 Rations signed by Maj Mann

#### May 16th 1866.

Collected \$2.00 from Dr Satchwell for writing out contracts for labor for 4 Freedmen employed by Dr S. Col. Rutherford collected the money & turned it over to Maj J.C Mann Q.M. Bureau


# May 18th 1866

Rations Drawn for Destitute Freedmen [[strikethrough]] Sub Dist Wilmington [[/strikethrough]] At Fort Anderson 30 children 40 women 7 days from date = 385 Rations from 17th to 23rd May 1866.
