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Instructions for Installation Museum of Television Culture

Jaime Davidovich 1982

1. The objects could be displayed in a case as shown on sketch 1. Also if you want to follow the design of the piece at Reina Sofia is fine too. I am very flexible.

2. The dimension for the units are on inches and app. The unit should be made of wood. The color to be painted has to match as much as possible the swatch paste on the sketch. It is a kind of yellow ochre.

3. The finish of the paint should be semi gloss

4. The thickness of the shelf should be app 1 inch. The space between shelf should be flexible

5. The logo pasted on a piece of board and displayed alongside unit (eye level)

6. The objects are small. The average size is 3 inches X 4 inches X 1 inch. The sizes varies. This is the reason that the shelves should be flexible.

7. I will send around 200 objects packed in 2 boxes. Each box weights around 12 pounds. The size of the box is 21 1/2 X 16 X 11 and the 2 boxes together is 121/2 X 16 X 21. I am enclosing pictures of the cardboard boxes. These boxes should be packed in a wooden crate (to be made) and ship it to you.

8. The last show of this collection was at MUMOK in Vienna. I prepared the boxes and they come to pick it up ,made the crate and ship directly to Vienna. They were very good. The name of the company is
