Dear Stuart,

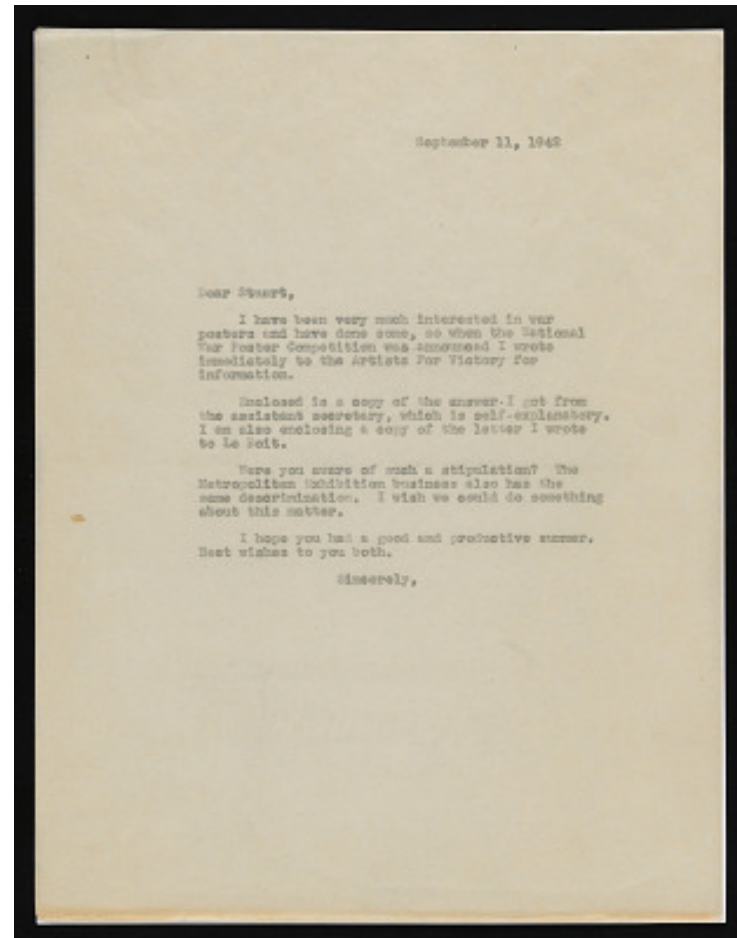
I have been very much interested in war posters and have done some, so when the National War Poster Competition was announced I wrote immediately to the Artists For Victory for information.
