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Celebrating 175: Ben Shahn, Social Security Building Mural, Washington DC, 1940-1941

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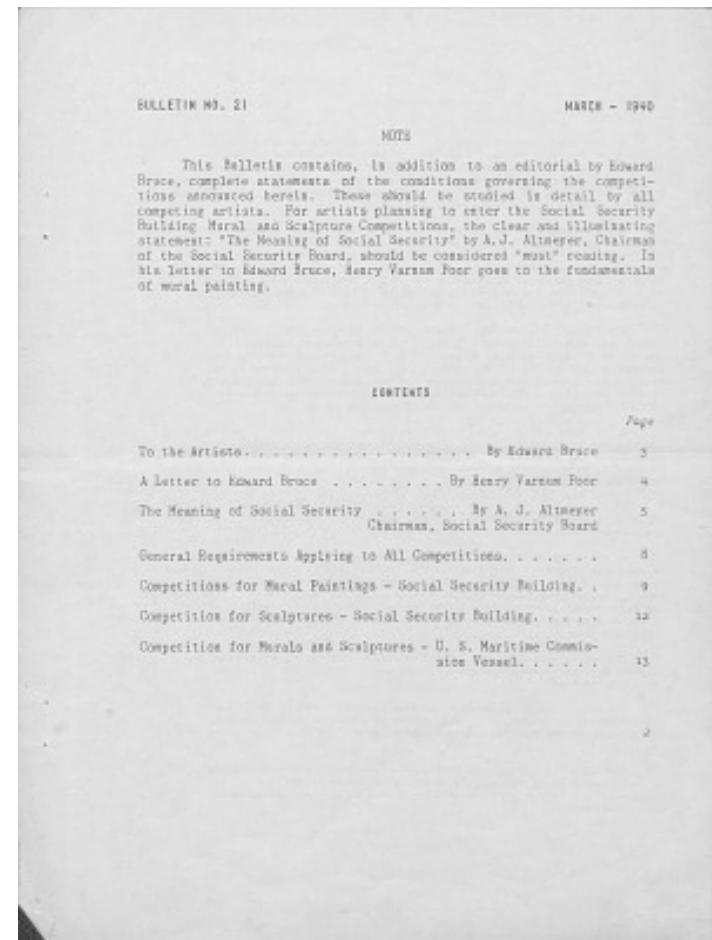
NOTE
