Dear Mrs. Bronson:

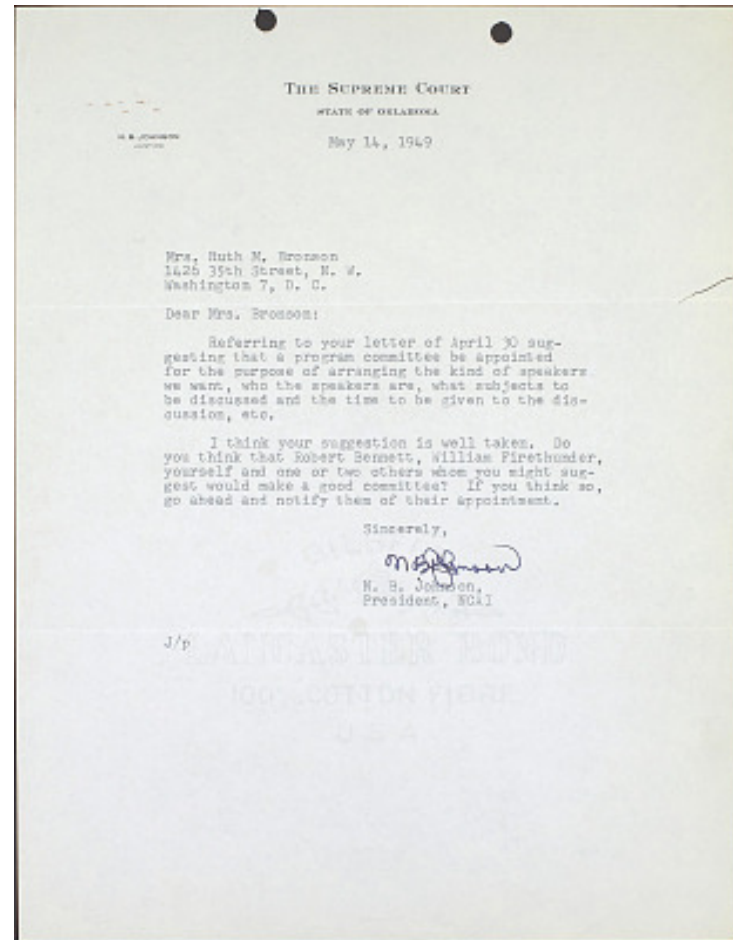
