While numbers of Indians appeared in the news last year, we mention two of our own NCAI leaders as symbols of good public relations: Mrs. Elizabeth Bender Roe Cloud, and again, when she was appointed National Indian Welfare Chairman, in the General Federation of Women's Clubs. The story of Louis Bruce, Jr. in "What America Means to Me," was published in the September, 1949, AMERICAN MAGAZINE and later in the READERS DIGEST and was read by millions.
