

In accordance with directions given me by Special Order No. 13th Office General Supt. Freedmens dated Memphis Tenn, Feby. 22nd 1865, to proceed to Little Rock Ark and assist Maj. W.G. Sargent in adjusting the Freedmen accounts for his Dept. I submit the following Financial Report showing all amounts received and disbursed. I found his papers pertaining to property, Freedmen's Goods and Funds for which he is accountable to the General Office, in a very satisfactory condition. Not only accounting for all Funds and property intrusted to him for disbursements in his Department, but exibiting a gain from sources of legitimate Revenue to the Dept of \$8476.72 as per Vouchers and Reports enclosed.
