14 July

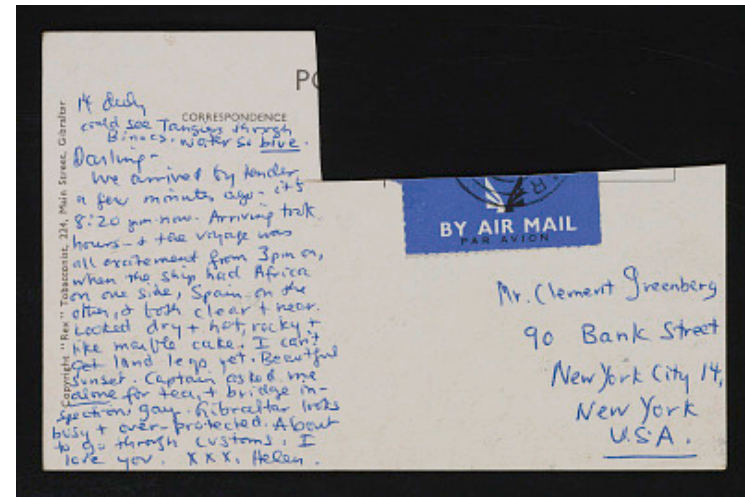
Could see Tangiers through Binocs. Water so blue.

I can't get land legs yet. Beautiful sunset. Captain asked me alone for tea, & bridge inspection. gay. Gibraltar looks busy & over-protected. About to go through customs. I love you. XXX, Helen.
