
THIRTY-NINTH CONGRESS, U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Washington D.C. Mar. 2 1866

My Dear Sir:

I beg to enclose for your consideration, an application from the Rev. C. Van Santvoord of Schenectady, New York, to be Chaplain under the Freedman's Bureau.
