We are not aware the cultivation of these lands has interfered with their prompt and faithful discharge of their official duties. We have been so much indebted to the Bureau for protection and vindication of our rights, in the past, and are still so dependent upon it for security in the future and also are under a great deal of debt of gratitude to Majs. Mann and Wickersham for their official and personal efforts in our behalf and have such confidence in their honor and integrity that we pray your Excellency to scrutinize well the accusations which are made against them by our enemies, and withhold condemnation until the truth can be developed. We pray you not to let our stronghold of defence be stricken down. And we will ever pray.
