Tilman Agent &c who asks if she is to feed and take care of freedmen coming from Richmond Va, at the expense of the Bureau. "For information as to whether" the Comr. "desires any Agent in NY. to take charge temporarily of parties of freedmen, going through the city to homes in the North, when coming from parts of the south other than this District." |

| April 6" 1867 #121. | Carey D. C. April 8" Referred to Genl E. Whittelsey A.I.G. | Baltimore Md April 5" 1867 Wishes to procure the supplies for distribution in the South, believing that from his knowledge of the market he can do so to the advantage of the Gov't. |

| April 6" 1867 #122. | Carroll A. E, Davis Geo E. April 8" Referred to A.C. of D.C. for investigation & will take such measures for the relief of these persons as he may deem proper. | Washington April 3" 1867. Forwards certificates of loyalty &c, and present destitution of Claressa Wilkinson & her 3 small boys & Philip Anderson & wife & Daughter living in Washington on N st bet 1/2 & 1" Sts. & requests that they be assisted by this Bureau. The parties themselves state they are in want & it would appear that Claressa is very feeble & broken down, &c. |

| April 6" 1867. #125. | Claroke G. B. April 6" Referred to Asst. Comr. of D.C. | Oxford. N.Y. March 25" 67. Requests information in regard to obtained farm hands (col'd) |

Com'r. | Washington April 6" 67. Forwards for information of the Com'r. letter from Asst Comr of Md. stating that the case of D. Brogden, (cold) against J. Q. Jarmy for distruction of property in Camp Meeting riot, at Shiplee Woods Md. With request that this matter be place in the hands of W. H. Owen, Solicitor &c. |

| April 9" 1867 #127. | Chipman & Hosmer & Co. Attorneys. See. B19 Vol 9. April 9" Referred to Genl Balloch for examination & remarks. April 10th 1867. Received back with report. E.B. p81. Vol 3. | Washington April 3" 1867. Transmits with statement papers relative to the claim of S. K. Birdsall for services rendered this Bureau for further consideration. |
