Dear Germain:

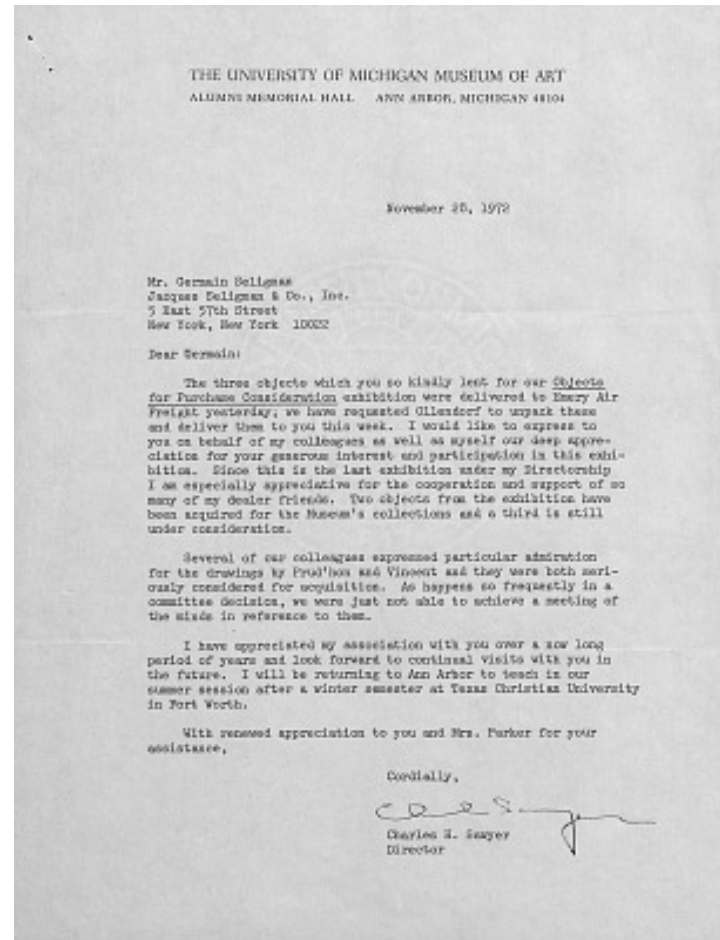
