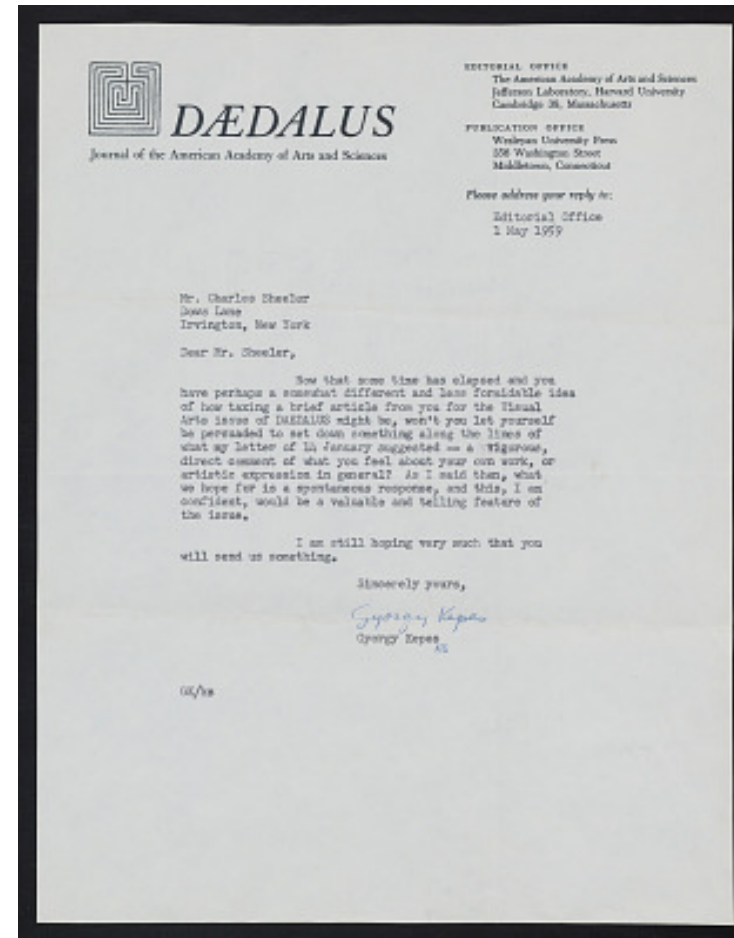
Dear Mr. Sheeler,
