Dear Don + Alice,

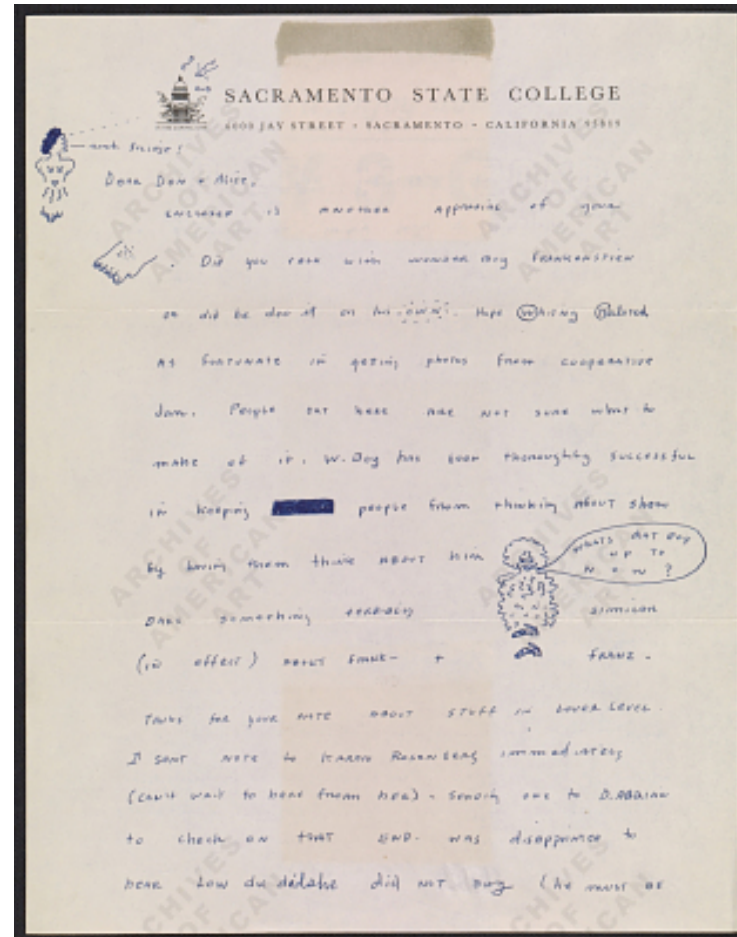
