Proposition of consolidating with Boonton was outvoted unanimously because it involved raising \$40,000. Van Sinderen proposed using our assets for subscribing in Bakelite Co. but matter was postponed. Then Van Sinderen took up question of cancellation of paper contract and modification of first Protal contract. Formula was read and much discussed. Stenographer of Williams & Peters muddled everything. then it was corrected a provisional copy handed to me. I told them wanted to have time to submit. it to Hasslacher as it was only fair that I should not make any unapproved changes on eve of important contract with General Bakelite Co.-they consented. The resolution was passed separately whereby phonograph

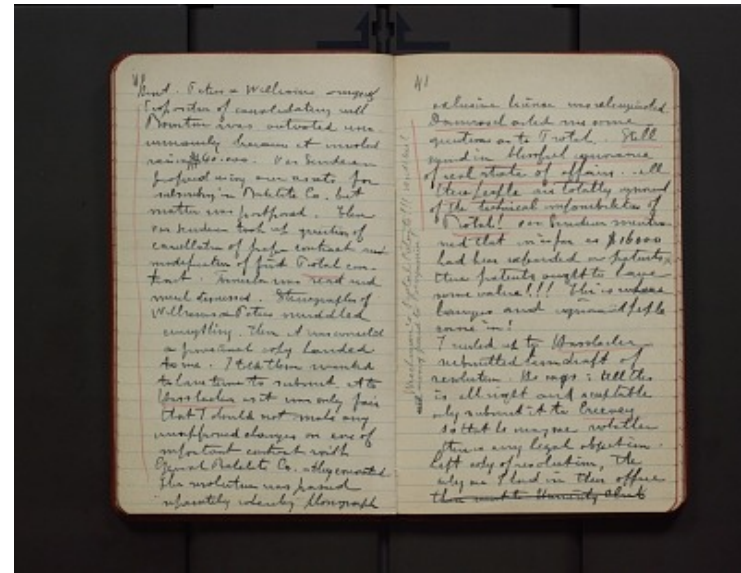
exclusive license was relinquished.

I rushed up to Hasslander submitted him draft of resolution. He says: all this is all right and acceptable only submit it to Creevey so that he may see whether there is any legal objection.
