

[[/underline in red]] this afternoon So concluded to stay here to make sure he would be ready Mr Aiden their expert arrived here at about 2 P.M. Showed him process and we made two [[strikeout]] records [[/strikeout]] discs. First one stuck second came off well. He says that in 1907 their company made 120 000 records daily. but [[?]] has dropped since financial panic. Is now

about 60.000 daily. Lewis drove him to station.

Oct. 25. Busy here all morning I had made Gotthelf try that [[underline in red]] 50% carbolic acid [[/underline in red]] of Barrett Mfg Co. He shows me sample of Bakelite made with it.
