

It is Saturday & no train for Manchester till Monday Went to Commercial Hotel & staid over night
Arrainged with a man to take us to Manchester with team in morning.

Had a good nights sleep. Started at 7. A.M. just sunrise. A clear, frosty morning ground froze & rough Had a good rig & team. Came through some little villages, Michigan Centre, Napoleon & Norval Good farms all [[end page]] [start page]] along, worn fences. fields of nice winter wheat, clover & orchards. Some good sized lakes & creeks - not many marshes -Timber all in small fields or lots. Walnut & hicory, White oak, Black oak, beech & maple & sycamore & elm & Basswood & ironwood -Country all fenced & improved -Small flocks of sheep - good good wrinkley merinos. Reached Uncle Wills at 11 A.M. Surprised them some. Lute & Alice were gone over to Berts - came back about 4 P.M.
