I appreciate your point about the exhibit specimens of Ternera and Iquique, it would be a pity to take samples from such specimens.

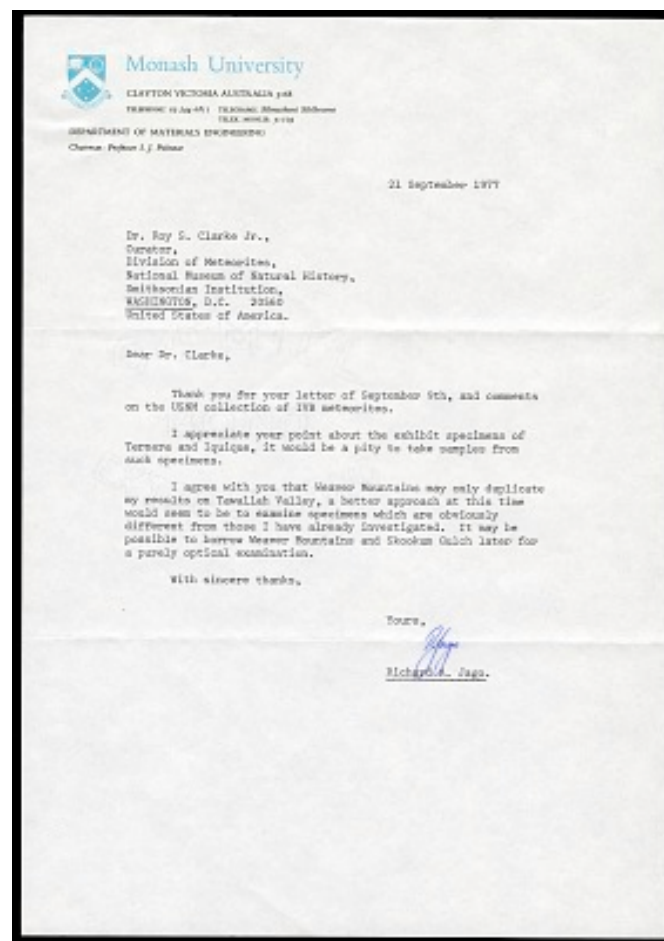
