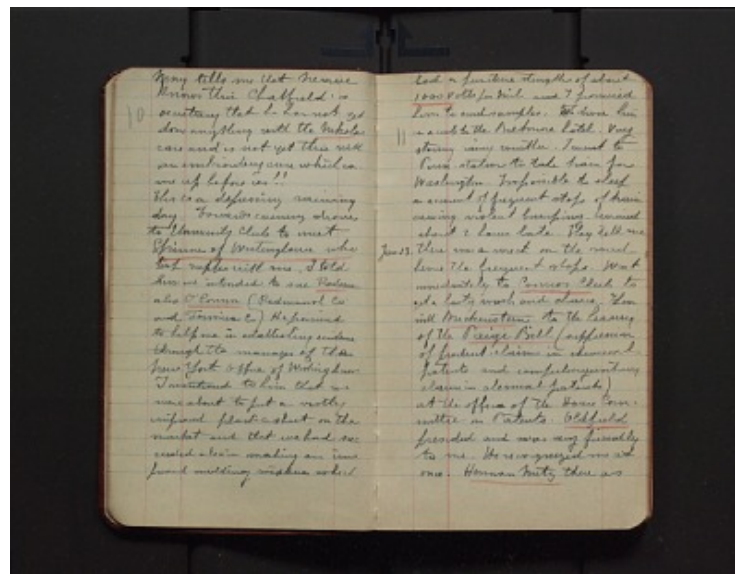
I mentioned to him that we were about to put a vastly improved plastic sheet on the market and that we had succeeded also in making an improved molding mixture which
