
Remained there till 5:30 P.M without interruption. Charge 7 hours to Hooker. Then back home with 6:15 P.M.

July 13 [[red underline]] Cygnet has been floated [[/red underline]] to Nyack late last night by means of empty beer barrels, but is not yet on the ways. Went to office met [[red underline]] May [[/red underline]] and [[red underline]] Rossi [[/red underline]] there. [[red underline]] Swan [[/red underline]]and [[red underline]] Gordon [[/red underline]] are finally off with new [[red underline]] No.600 and new plastic sheet [[/red underline]].
