
October 24,1915 (Sunday)
Beautiful bright day. Celine and I went out on [[red underline]]"Cygnet"[[/red underline]] about 11 A.M. along the Palisade shore to 125th then back again [[strikethrough]] to [[/strikethrough]]as far as "Verdrietige Hook". It was rather cold when against the wind. Just at our moorings at sunset.

October 25. Caught cold in the head yesterday and feel rather oppressed all day.

Oct. 26. A [[red underline]] buy order [[/red underline]] sheet today over [[red underline]]\$5000 .[[underscore/superscript]]00[[/underscore/superscript]][[/red underline]]. This makes booked orders for October already [[red underline]] \$73000 [[underscore/superscript]]00[[/underscore/superscript]][[/red underline]] by far the record.
