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

Dec. 3. again beautiful weather. Awakened early by flying of near by [[underlined in red]] aviation station [[/underlined in red]]] By and by we get so familiar with [[underlined in red]] these flying machines [[/underlined in red]] that it makes us feel more [[underlined in red]]] confident in George's [[/underlined in red]] chances Went for a stroll in town met [[underlined in red]] Mr. Lyons [[/underlined in red]] of [[underlined in red]] Foot powder [[/underlined in red]] fame who drove us to his pretty house on the Bay and invited us for lunch. Water so transparent that we see the white and sandy bottom about 50 - 60 feet deep. Corals and sponges and fishes.
