Dec. 10. Very cold. A busy day taking up belated correspondence. Rossi phoned about threatening Cresol situation for one month's supply. He came here this afternoon, remained for supper, gave me his report and conclusions. Was glad to see that he had acted very well and entirely agree with his conclusions to place order for 2,000,000 lbs in England and refuse it here instead of paying absurd prices to Barrett. He reports that progress has been made in new molding mixture. Very satisfactory

Dec 11. More dictation thru belated mail. Afternoon young Paul de Vecchi came here to ask for address and introductions to Washington to enter Aviation service

Have just been accepted as member there. Rather like the general impression. Club is undoubtedly nearer spirit of Cosmos Club and not so frigid and snobish as University Club.

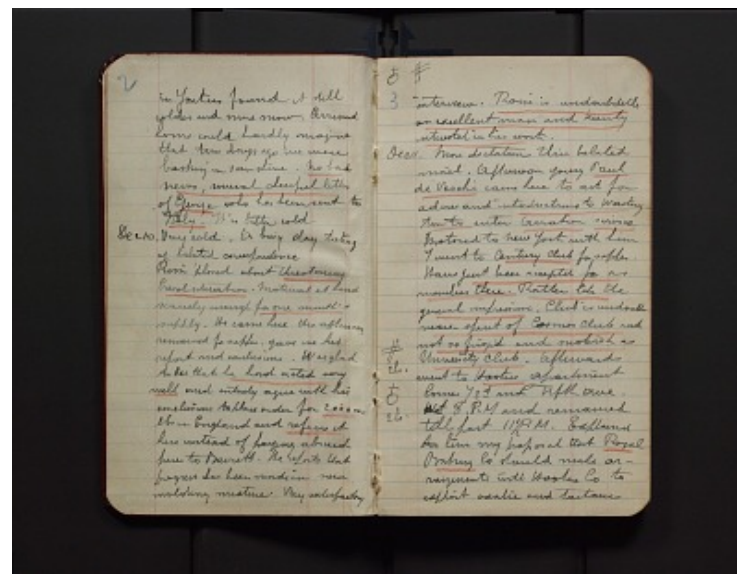
