Afternoon Nina arrived here with Miss Anthony. Like usually her first remark was a kick and complaint - same selfishness as ever. Irritates me, specially when she displays her selfishness and

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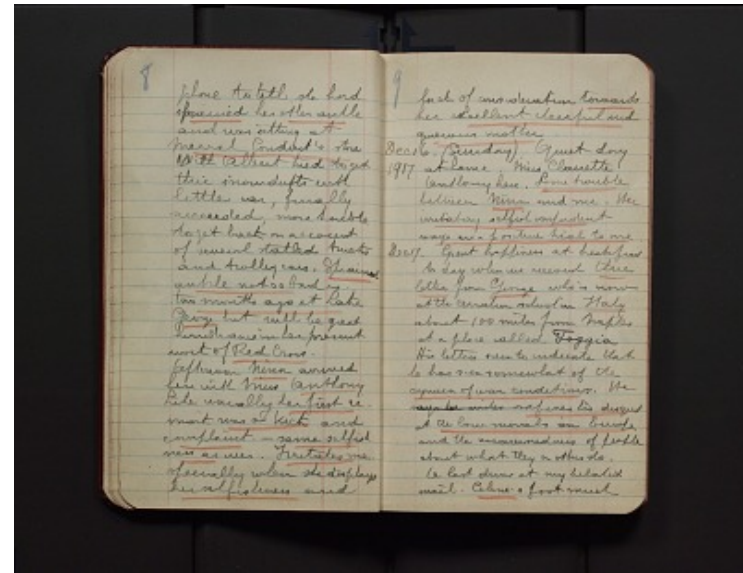
lack of consideration towards her excellent cheerful and generous mother.

Dec 16, 1917 (Sunday) Quiet day at home. Miss Clarette Anthony here. Same trouble between Nina and me. Her irritating selfish impudent ways are a positive trial to me.

Dec 17. Great happiness at breakfast to day when we received three letters from George who is now at the Aviation school in Italy about 100 miles from Naples at a place called Foggia

His letters seem to indicate that he has seen somewhat of the cynicism of war conditions. He ~~may be under~~ expresses his disgust at the low morals in Europe and the unconcernedness of people about what they or others do.
