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

A walk to the shore. [[red underline]] Delightful.- wonderful feel very very happy. [[/red underline]] An excellent nights rest Aug 28. Another beautiful day Left at about 11 A.M for Montreal. Passed the [[red underline]] Plattsburgh Camp [[/red underline]] for aspirant officers. Many young [[red underline]] men in soldier's [[/red underline]] uniform then on to Canada! Short formality

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for my car at [[red underline]] Rouse's Point [[/red underline]] then on along good roads towards [[red underline]] Canada. [[/red underline]] Now and then a picturesque Log Cabin reminding of early settlers' times -- then by and by French inscriptions
