allowed to Goldsmith. All this Neave did in a very dignified but gentlemanly way

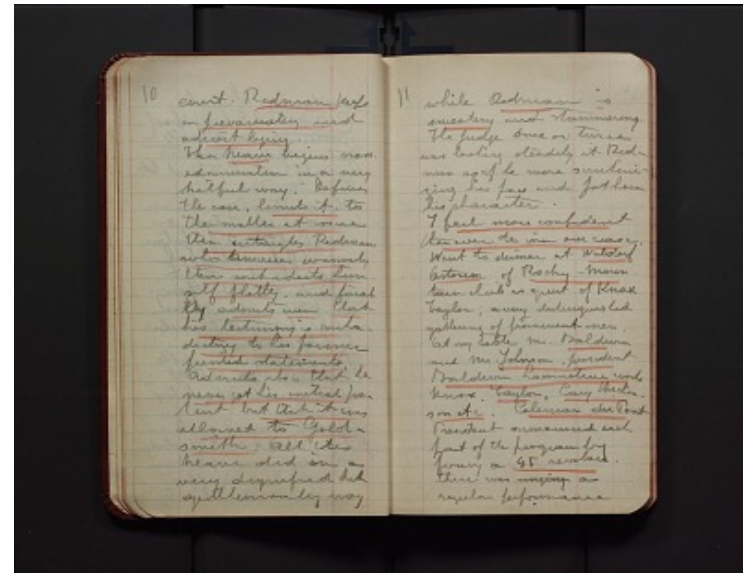
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while Redman is sweating and stammering. The judge once or twice was looking steadily at Redman as if he were scrutinizing his face and fathom his character.
