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

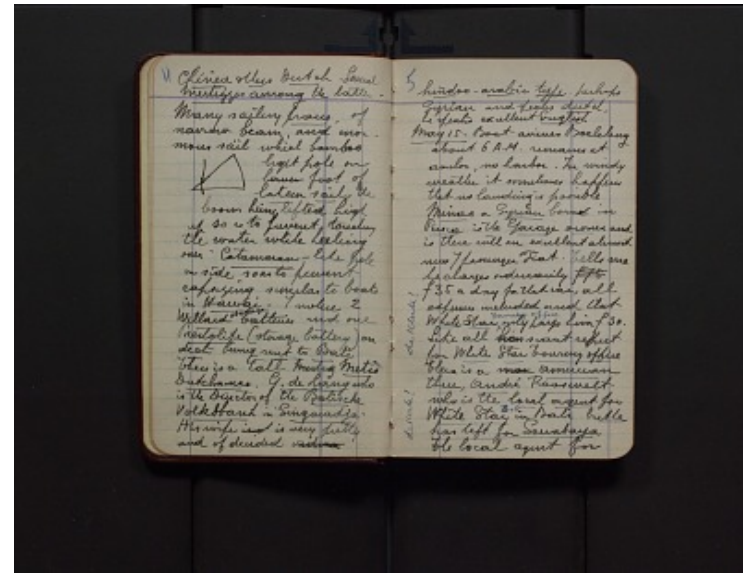
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hindoo-arabic type, perhaps Syrian and speaks dutch, he speaks excellent English.
