

Also letter of Celine and letters Bishop, Perkins etc. Spent all afternoon studying the mail and noting my answers in margin returning original letters. Long night letter to George and one to Office and one to Munroe. George wants vacation ^{^((in))} Trinidad. Wired and wrote him have no objection provided he takes vacation after my return. R&H undoubtedly want to stirr things up so as to beat some cash out of Bakelite. end page start page

March 7. Lovely morning at anchor Key West. Wrote long letter pencil to George on the R&H proposal also letter to Jacobi with promissory note collectable after death as suggested by Hays. March 8. Anchor Key West. Swimming sailing. Turtle steak. Fresh enormous turtles being brought here by schooner and converted to turtle soup. Continuous splendid weather Getting very brown. Am in touch with office thru telegraph and mail. and spend mornings answering mail and preparing night letter telegrams Dr. George W. Warren of New York here at anchor with his Schooner "Yankee Girl" flying burgee of Cruising Club. Sent telegram to George to file Bender Japanese patent and advise him to engage patent man if competent and trustworthy
