Evening went with Celine to see the Coconut Grove Movie. [[in purple ink]][[underline]] Feb. 13 [[/underline]] This afternoon went to long motor-ride to Cocoplum and return. and felt in excellent condition. [[underline]] Feb. 14. [[/underline]] Went to [[red underline]] Sears Robuck Store [[/red underline]] to inquire about purchasing a [[red underline]] radio for any yacht. [[/red underline]] [[/purple ink]] - then to Burdine's store. -Large amount of visitors in both stores. - Beautiful bright weather. [[end page]] [[start page]] Feb. 15.
