I have always advised the use of these seeds - with no charge for advise - other than the reward of doing a good turn.

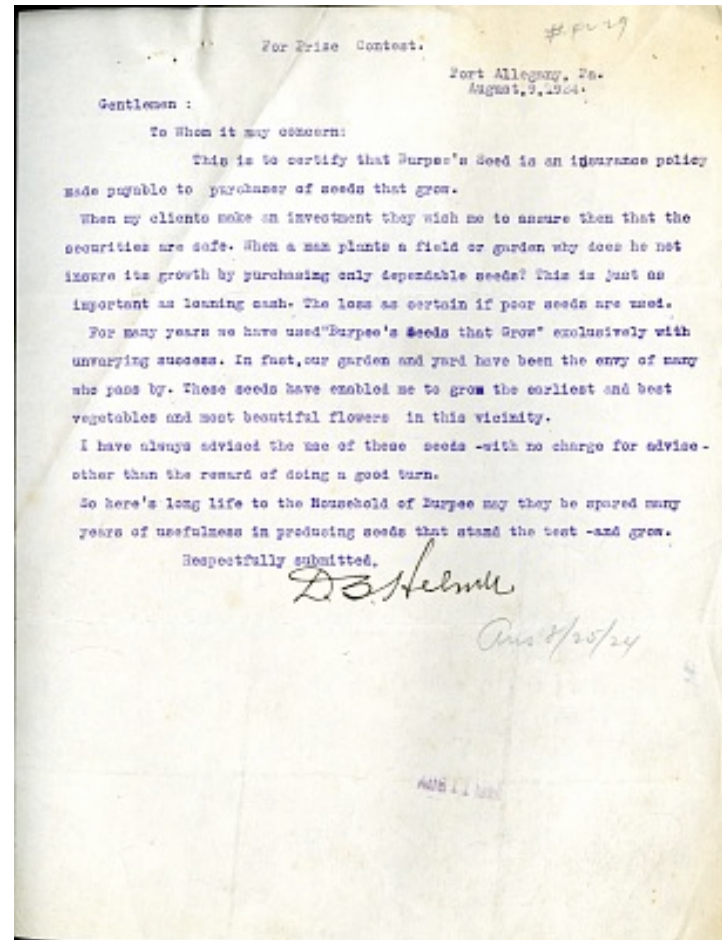
So here's long life to the Household of Burpee may they be spared many years of usefulness in producing seeds that stand the test - and grow.
