At the sight of our men, the people fled into the mountaines; nevertheless,they went to their tents, where learning certaine trifles of ours, as glasses bels, knives & such like things, they departed, not taking any thing of theirs except one dogge.

They did in like manner leave behind them, a letter, pen, [[strikethrough]]ink[[/strikethrough]] incke and paper, whereby our men, whome the Captaine lost the yeere before, and in that peoples custodie, might (if any of them were alive) be advertised of our pretence, and bring them."


