Mr. W. de F. Haynes has continued his donations to the Museum in presenting us with a collection of fifty-two specimens of archeology from Manabi, Ecuador.


Dr. George Bird Grinnell has generously presented the Museum with a collection of pipes, collected in Montana many years ago.
