

Paris, November 16th/94
Dear Mr. Hecker,
I arrived in Paris on Saturday last the 10th inst and the following afternoon Dewing came -- Well, its been one continued whirl eversince.
[[strikethrough]] So [[/strikethrough]] This morning we seperated for the day so as to give each one of us a chance to make some personal calls and to also attend to correspondence. Surely my own is sadly behind. I had no letters forwarded from Paris, consequently upon arrival here, I found from you #2, 3, 4 & 5 and this afternoon, #6 came.
