Last season he recreated his role in Nevis Mountain Dew in Los Angeles and also made a guest appearance on the Lou Grant Show. A native New Yorker, Mr. Brown began his acting career with the Howard University Players. He was a founding member of the Tyrone Guthrie Theater in Minneapolis and has also been seen on Broadway in The Man in the Glass Booth and Weekend.
