You will excuse the liberty I take in writing direct to you, but this is not a business matter, and I am sure you will greatly enjoy what I am referring to.

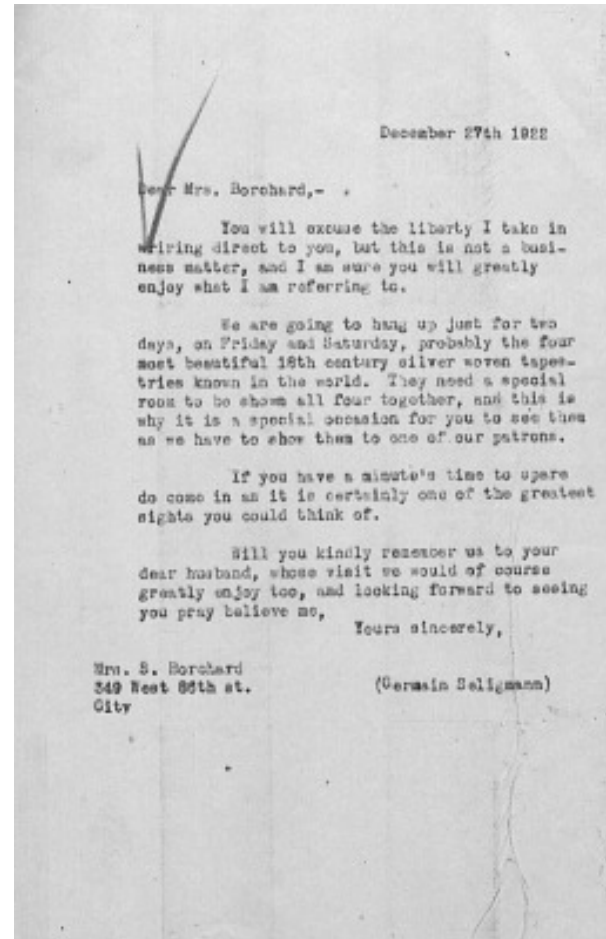
