My dear friend,-

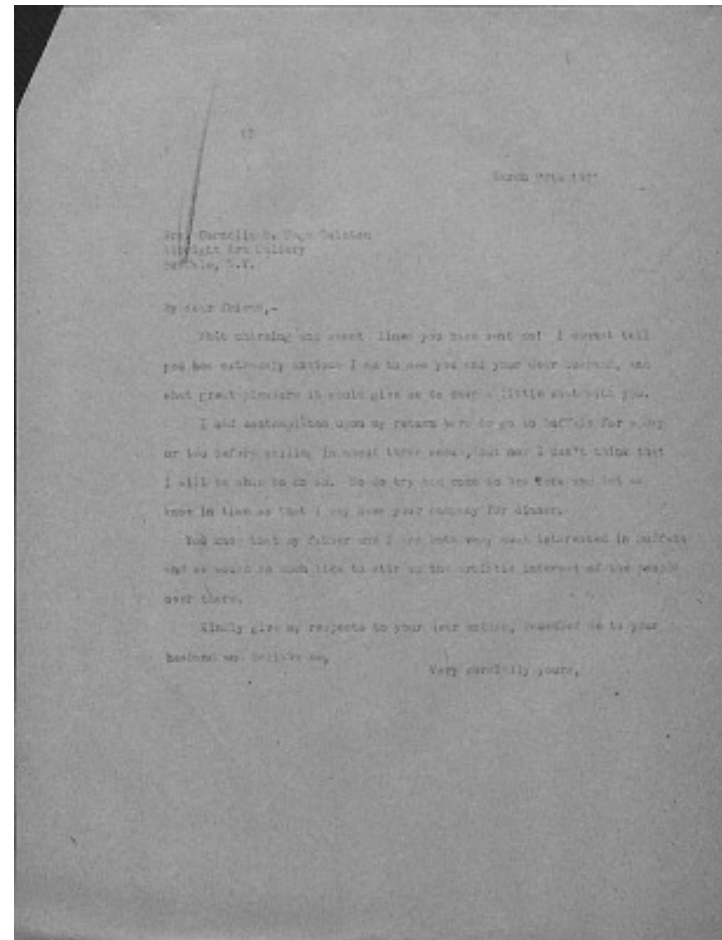
