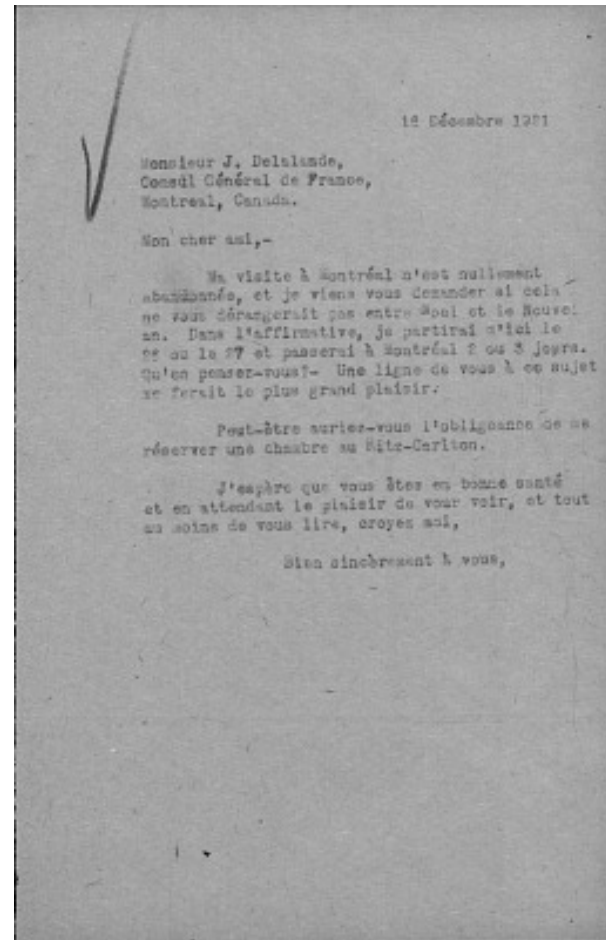
Mon cher ami,-
