My dear Mr. Seligmann:

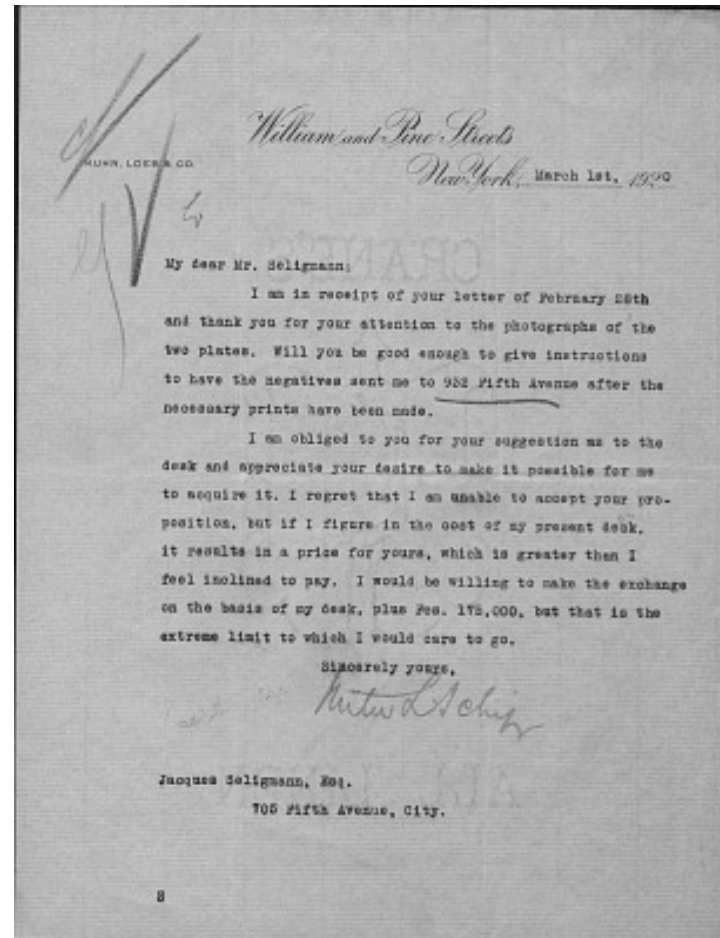
