I have heard quite often of your beautiful collection, and even in Paris I was told of the beautiful things that you have been collecting in the past few years.

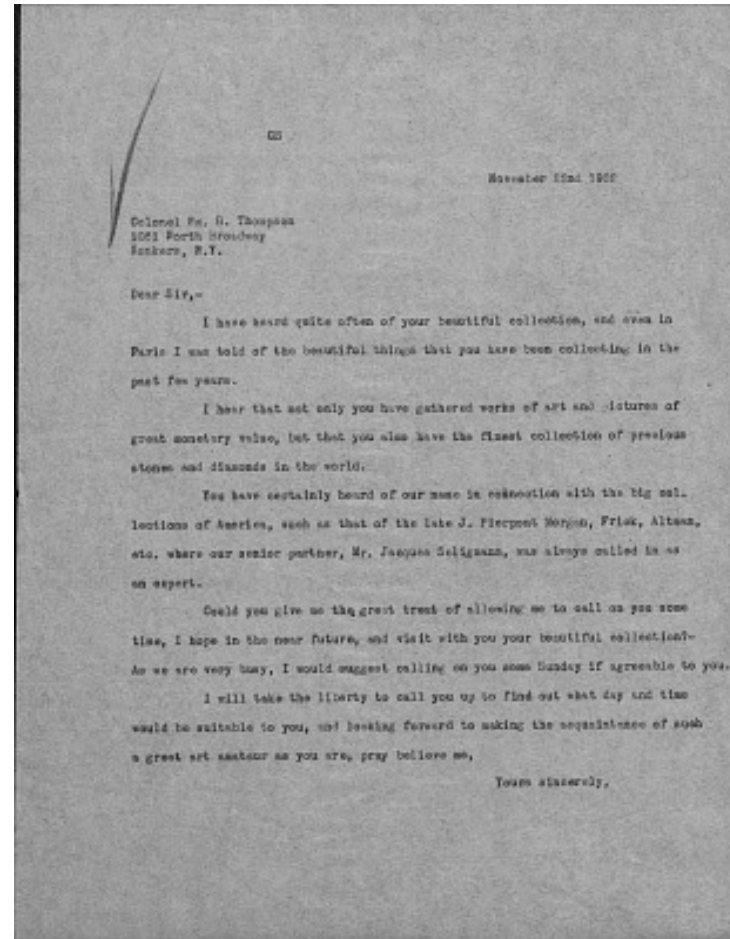
I hear that not only you have gathered works of art and pictures of great monetary value, but that you also have the finest collection of precious stones and diamonds in the world.
